


This week's Word of the Month is:





Continuing our discussion and practice with identifying feelings, Zones of Regulation and coping skills we will discuss problem solving with the students.






The ZONES of Regulation



Indigenous Learning

INDIGENOUS WELLNESS

Wellness is often expressed by leading a life that invites the balance of mind, body, spirit and emotion. For many Indigenous nations, these teachings are embedded in the Medicine Wheel. There are many variations of the medicine wheel including the use of different colors, animals, and plants. If you see different variations of the wheel, they are not wrong, they just have different origins. It is also important to note that not all Indigenous people use the medicine wheel.



With the reemergence of Indigenous teachings, the medicine wheel became used as a framework in Indigenous wellness programming, organizations, and other areas of support as it offered a method to gauge holistic balance whether utilized at the individual, family, community, or organizational level. It created space for cultural continuity in spaces that our culture was denied or ignored by mainstream Euro-western health and wellness programming.
